

Public Exhibition & Response to Submissions for Stage 1


The 28-day public exhibition period for Stage 1 concluded on 24-May. Public submissions made are now published on the NSW Government's Planning Portal:

Neoen received 111 submissions in response to the project. We are now in the process of responding to these submissions together with some of our subject matter experts who completed the detailed assessments.

New England Renewable Energy Zone (REZ)

The Thunderbolt Energy Hub is being proposed in the New England REZ, announced by NSW Government in late 2021. The New England REZ is proposed to deliver 8 GW of renewable energy to support the transition to a renewable energy-based

electricity market.

The REZ is expected to generate \$10.7 billion investment, 1,250 construction jobs and 830 operations jobs. The REZ plays a vital role in delivering affordable, reliable generation to NSW consumers to help replace the State's existing power stations as they approach their end of life. Eathorpe Battery

Neoen are currently exploring the feasibility of another renewable energy project in the New England REZ. The large-scale battery project, called the Eathorpe Battery, is proposed approximately 5km east of Armidale CBD and is proposed to have a capacity of 100MW. The battery will connect directly into the existing Armidale substation, which is adjacent to the proposed project.

The proposed location is centrally located within the New England REZ. It is hoped that a battery in this location can play its part in supporting the NSW Government to achieve a smooth transition towards their goal of 8,000MW of renewable energy capacity in this REZ.
